



## Michigan Multistakeholder CPC+ Briefing February 2020

This briefing is authored by the Michigan Multipayer CPC+ Team (*and not by CMS or a CMS contractor*) and is made possible through support from BCBSM and Priority Health (our CPC+ commercial payer partners) to support CPC+ success in our state.

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### [Quick Tips Guide Sheet for Reporting 2019 Commercial CPC+ Revenue to CMS](#)

CMS requires CPC+ practices to submit information on revenue received from each commercial payer for the 2019 calendar year by February 28, 2020, CMS. As a helpful tool for CPC+ POs and practices in Michigan, a [Quick Tips Sheet for Reporting 2019 Commercial Revenue](#) has been developed to assist you.

The [Quick Tips Sheet](#) provides fuller information, but in brief in brief:

- Both BCBSM and Priority Health will compile and provide POs with practice-specific reports of the elements that CMS requires be reported for each payer 1) the number of attributed CPC+ commercial members; 2) the amount of revenue (i.e., including care management G and CPT codes, incentives, Value-Based Reimbursement, etc.) that each practice received from each commercial payer for its CPC+ attributed members; 3) the percentage tied to cost or quality performance (i.e., is "at risk"); and 4) the amount of bonus payments received in 2019 that were for an earlier year (e.g., 2018 or 2017) related to CPC+ commercial revenue.
- BCBSM will distribute practice-specific reports to POs that detail the revenue disbursed to each CPC+ practice for its attributed CPC+ BCBSM membership by February 10, 2020. Reports will cover a twelve-month period from January 2019 to December 2019 that should be reported as 2019 CPC+ revenue to CMS. (If your practice is in the small number that are not PCMH PGIP-designated, the only CPC+ payment you would reflect is related to Clinical Quality VBR and G/CPT codes billed for provider-delivered care management.)
- Priority Health will distribute practice-specific reports to ACNs (POs) that detail the revenue disbursed to each CPC+ practice for its attributed CPC+ Priority membership by February 21, 2020. The reports will use the latest and most complete data available and are anticipated to cover the entire 2019 calendar year period.

## [Recap of January 8, 2020 PO/Practice/CMS Multistakeholder Webinar](#)

CMS and TMF have published [notes](#) and graciously shared them with attendees. These include answers to questions that time prohibited us from fully covering on the webinar. ## [What Would You Like to See at the May 28<sup>th</sup> In-Person Learning Session?](#)

At each of the semiannual In-Person CPC+ Learning Sessions, we have the opportunity to host a multipayer session to support success for CPC+ practices in Michigan. They shared updates and work that the subcommittees have produced for CPC+ practices and POs in Michigan.

## [Multipayer CPC+ Dashboard Update from the Michigan Data Collaborative](#)

The Michigan Data Collaborative (MDC) continue to make progress on the CPC+ Michigan Multipayer Dashboard. Here is an update on recent work and developments:

- MDC continues to work towards the release of a CPC+ Michigan Multipayer Dashboard that includes Medicare, BCBSM and Priority Health data.
- MDC continues to execute DUA's with Michigan POs and practices and looks forward to onboarding users and launching the CPC+ Dashboard. As of today, Data Use Agreements covering 64% of practices have been executed. MDC will soon begin the onboarding process to grant access to the Dashboards by reaching out to the PO and Practice Acknowledgers to verify user access. Access can be setup at the PO or Practice level.
- Highlights of what you will find in the dashboard include:
  - An overview of your population with demographic information like age, gender, community (rural or urban), payer and chronic condition prevalence.
  - The capability to measure results and see comparisons to the CPC+ Michigan performance average.
  - An insights page to easily identify areas for improvement, as well as bright spots in your organization's CPC+ performance.
  - Drill downs to the patient level.
  - Comparisons across Managing Organizations and Practices to support collaboration for improvement.

We also wanted to share that the University of Michigan contracting and legal review is taking longer than

anticipated. This may impact the targeted release date of March 31, 2020. The CPC+ Team is working with all levels of organizational Leadership to mitigate this delay. More details regarding launch date and contingency planning will be shared as Contract approvals progress.
